### **BILLS SCORED IN THIS SCORECARD**

### Column 1

H.B. 1048: Enhancing the Washington voting rights act. *Election fraud bill allowing non-citizens to vote*.

### Column 2

H.B. 1155: Addressing the collection, sharing, and selling of consumer health data. *Prevents cell phone contact with women at abortion centers in order to share alternative options.* 

### Column 3

H.B. 1340: Concerning actions by health professions disciplining authorities against license applicants and license holders.

Prevents legal action against health practitioners for abortion or genital mutilation.

### Column 4

H.B. 1469: Concerning access to reproductive health care services and gender-affirming treatment in Washington state. *Makes Washington a 'sanctuary' for out-of-state children seeking abortion or gender-changing procedures.* 

### Column 5

S.B. 5082: Encouraging electoral participation and making ballots more meaningful by abolishing advisory votes. *Removes the tax advisory votes from our ballots.* 

### Column 6

S.B. 5112: Updating processes related to voter registration. *Election fraud bill allowing voter registration at Dept. of Licensing.* 

### Column 7

S.B. 5179: Increasing access to the provisions of the Washington death with dignity act. *Expands assisted suicide parameters and eliminates safeguards*.

### Column 8

S.B. 5242: Prohibiting cost sharing for abortion. *Eliminates co-pays / out-of-pocket expenses for abortion and shifts cost to taxpayers & private insurance.* 

### Column 9

S.B. 5599: Supporting youth and young adults seeking protected health care services. *Hides children from parents if seeking abortion or gender changes.* 

### Column 10

S.B. 5768: Protecting access to abortion medications by authorizing the department of corrections to acquire, sell, deliver, distribute, and dispense abortion medications. Washington Department of Corrections allowed to purchase, sell and dispense abortion pill.
